#### A Green Miracle?

Miracle (mir-uh-kuh l), noun.

- 1. An effect or extraordinary event in the physical world that surpasses all known human or natural powers and is ascribed to a supernatural cause.
- 2. Such an effect or event manifesting or considered as a work of God.
- 3. A wonder; marvel.

Does any of this apply to the goals and the work of Hoosier Hills Food Bank? Number 1 doesn't seem to fit. Many of our donors and agencies are driven by different types of faith traditions and would assert that No. 2 applies. But No. 3 without question describes what happens here...not just at Christmas or the holidays, but all year.

We themed our annual meeting in March with Kermit the Frog's treatise on "bein' green." We talked about how things that seemed ordinary or routine could actually be extraordinary...and about how that applied to the huge, ongoing community effort that starts with donors and volunteers and works its way through agencies and programs to help transform the lives of people by ensuring they have the food they need.

Through the end of November, we've distributed 4,455,943 pounds of food. That is 232,000 pounds more than in ALL OF 2017...and 158 pounds more than our record year of 2016. December is one of our busiest months and we've already distributed an all-time record amount of food.

A miracle? Perhaps – depends on your point of view. A wonder? A marvel? Absolutely.

It's an incredible statement about this community. Dozens of agencies, hundreds of food donors, hundreds of financial contributors, thousands of volunteers. Individuals, small businesses, large corporations, churches and places of faith, organizations, elected officials, students, retirees. Agreeing in one voice despite being different from each other:

Not one child. Not one senior. And not one in between. Hunger is not an option.

Thank you for your support. And whether your tradition is Christmas, Hanukkah, Kwanzaa, Eid, or simply gathering with friends and family...we wish you joy and happiness now and in the coming year.

November and December are two of the busiest months of the year for HHFB and our partner agencies. As families prepare for holiday meals, travel, guests, gifts and other traditions, budgets become even more strained for those on the margins. Fortunately, many people also step up with food drives and donations. Getting food in and out the door keeps our staff and volunteers busy!



Everyone tries to go the extra mile to make the holidays great for our agencies and clients. We've been busy disbursing lots of food to agencies and we were excited to be able to deliver apples, milk and some other items to support Pantry 279's heroic efforts to provide 1400 families with a Thanksgiving food box in November, and to deliver some food and goodies to Community Kitchen for their annual Thanksgiving grocery giveaway that supplements the delicious meal they make for hundreds of people. We'll have the same partnership with the Kitchen on Christmas Day.

Our Bedford and Mitchell mobile pantries took place the week after Thanksgiving and the menu included ground beef, frozen blueberries, fresh apples, snacks and lots of canned goods. Thanks to support from Lucky's Market and the Martin County Community Foundation we are also able to provide fresh apples, oranges and potatoes to many agencies in December. Our mobile pantry in Shoals will feature all three items.
